### NetSmartz Neighborhood

Meet Webster, Clicky (the NetSmartz spokesrobot), and Nettie (Webster's sister). These online friends help elementary aged children learn the lessons taught in the Grades K-2 and Grades 3-6 presentations.



### Grades K-2 (20 minutes)

Clicky is a co-presenter and introduces children to the Webville Outlaws—characters to the left who represent the possible dangers children could face online. Children then answer questions to an Internet safety quiz to “round up” the Outlaws.



### Grades 3-6 (40 Minutes)

Facilitators team up with Nettie and Webster to introduce children to the WizzyWigs—characters to the left who represent the possible dangers to children online. Children learn rules to remember if they are confronted with these dangers and are then tested on what they learn. Clicky “raps” up the presentation.



### Teens and Tweens (45-60 minutes)

This eye opening presentation explains Internet risks to teens with professional slides blended with real-life stories told by the actual victims of Internet exploitation. In addition a vignette called “Tracking Theresa” shows how easy it is to track someone online.



### Parents/Communities (60 minutes)

This presentation is an extensive educational presentation on Internet safety with slides detailing dangers, statistics, resources, and tips in addition to NetSmartz interactive materials to use with children.
